TRAPDOOR-ERA NOTES

* A few prairie cartridge belts with flaps were developed for trial in 1885.

* Wooden pistol grips were declared obsolete in 1885.

* Issuance of Model 1884 rifles commenced on Dec. 31, 1885. They replaced all earlier model rifles in the hands of troops, including magazine rifles that were still in the field for trials. There was a great deal of dissatisfaction with the Model 1884 rear sight, which was found to be easily damaged and to lose its settings. It was also found that the cam latch came loose as a result of the end of the cam latch shaft being ground off flush. To overcome the latter objection, Springfield discontinued grinding the cam latch shafts in June, 1886. Then in Aug., 1886, the rear sight was modified by fitting larger knobs and making other small changes.

* By 1886, a wooden wiping rod was being issued with each carbine. Some cal. .50 Sharps brushes and thongs were also issued for use with cal. .45 carbines.

* The Whittemore rifle trial, carried out in March and April 1886, reopened the issue of the correct cam to be used in the Trapdoor breechblock.

* In early 1886, 150 Model 1884 rod bayonet rifles were sent to Ft. Lincoln for trial.

* The proper length of pistol grip screws was stated to be as follows:

Rifle before 1882	1 3/4"
Rifle after 1882	2"
Carbine	1.58"

* A modified sling hook was approved on Apr. 26, 1886 (see illustration of Flagler sling on pg. 3)

* Effective Apr. 20, 1886, "R" and "C" were no longer stamped on cartridge heads.

* The 3-click tumbler was not well liked, and many rifles had the earlier 2-click tumbler installed in the field. One of the problems was that the hammer could be lowered such that the sear rested on the edge of the tumbler notch, resulting in a dangerous condition. The sear nose was altered in Aug., 1886, so that this was not possible.

* In late 1886, F. W. Freund filed a patent suit against the Ord. Dept. over detachable pistol grips.

* In April, 1887, Col. Kelton proposed a "speed loader" for the Schofield revolver, similar to the ones used with modern double action revolvers.

* Col. Kelton also developed a detachable, gravity-feed magazine for the Trapdoor. During its trial in May, 1887, it was found that the magazine tended to come loose.

* Still another Kelton development was a hammerless version of the trapdoor action. Some details from his 1886 design are shown on pg. 12.

* In May, 1887, the commander of Troop D, 1st Cav., which was stationed at Ft. Custer, D. T., requisitioned 62 Model 1879 sights to replace the Model 1884 sights on the 24-in. bbl. Experimental Carbines that had been issued to them. Springfield responded by furnishing 20 more Model 1884s.

* Replacement stocks for 1st and 2nd models Hotchkiss Navy rifles were procured from Winchester in 1887.

* Maj. Isaac Arnold proposed the addition of a brass reinforcement at the mouth of carbine scabbards to prevent damage to the Model 1884 sights. This was approved in June, 1887, and many existing scabbards were so altered.

* In August, 1887, the front sight blade was rounded at the rear to avoid tearing clothing.

* A test of the Morse movable base cartridge was carried out in Dec., 1887.

EARLY RELOADING TOOLS

Reloading the service cartridges was not practical until development of the Model 1881 reloading cartridges. Sets of hand reloading tools were issued to the field starting in 1881, and bench reloading tools for field use were produced by Frankford Arsenal starting in Nov., 1885. The bench sets initially allowed reloading of both rifle cartridges (2.1-in. and 2.4-in. cases) as well as carbine and revolver cartridges. Modified components were later issued to adapt these tools to reloading the Morse cartridge. Separate loading tools were furnished for the shotgun as part of the "shot gun outfit".

BATTLE OF PLATTSBURGH LANDING RIFLES

A resolution of Congress dated May 20, 1826, authorized the presentation of rifles to 17 members of the New York militia in recognition of their gallantry during the Battle of Plattsburgh Landing in Sept., 1814. In a key action of the

War of 1812, this small force of Americans prevented the landing of British troops on the shore of Lake Champlain. The rifles that were subsequently made up were Hall's flintlocks, each with a silver plate suitably inscribed with the name of the intended recipient. Not all of these rifles were actually presented, however; and in 1885, the widow of one of them tried to find out what had happened to his. This correspondence gives quite a bit of information about how the distribution of these arms was handled, and I will be glad to make a copy available to anyone who has one of these historical rifles.

SERIAL NUMBER DATA IN THIS ISSUE

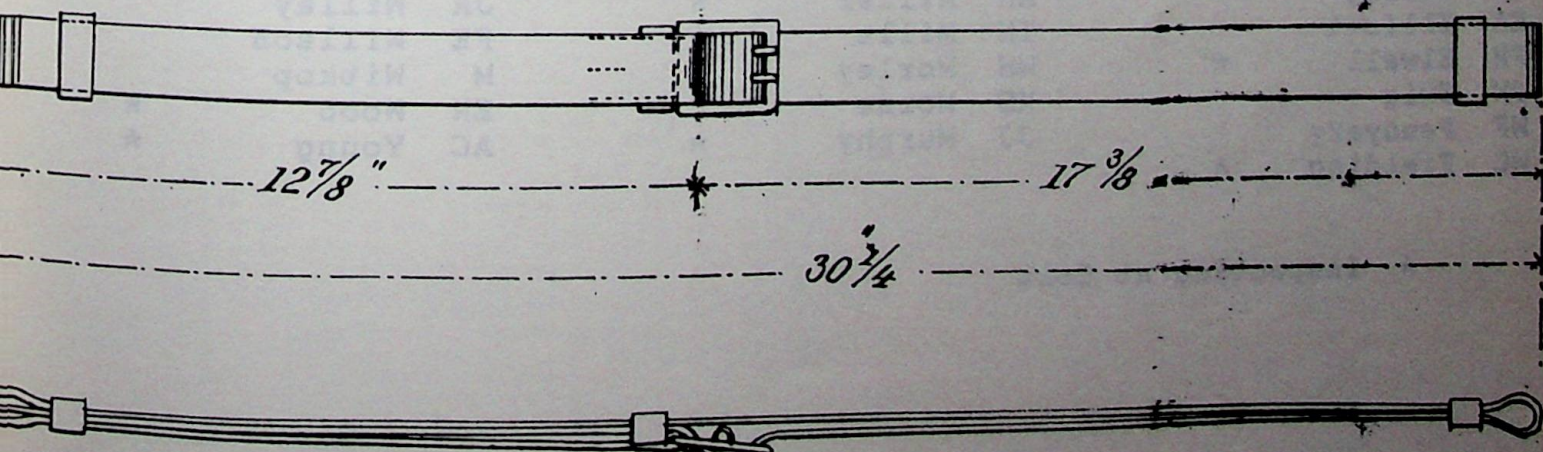

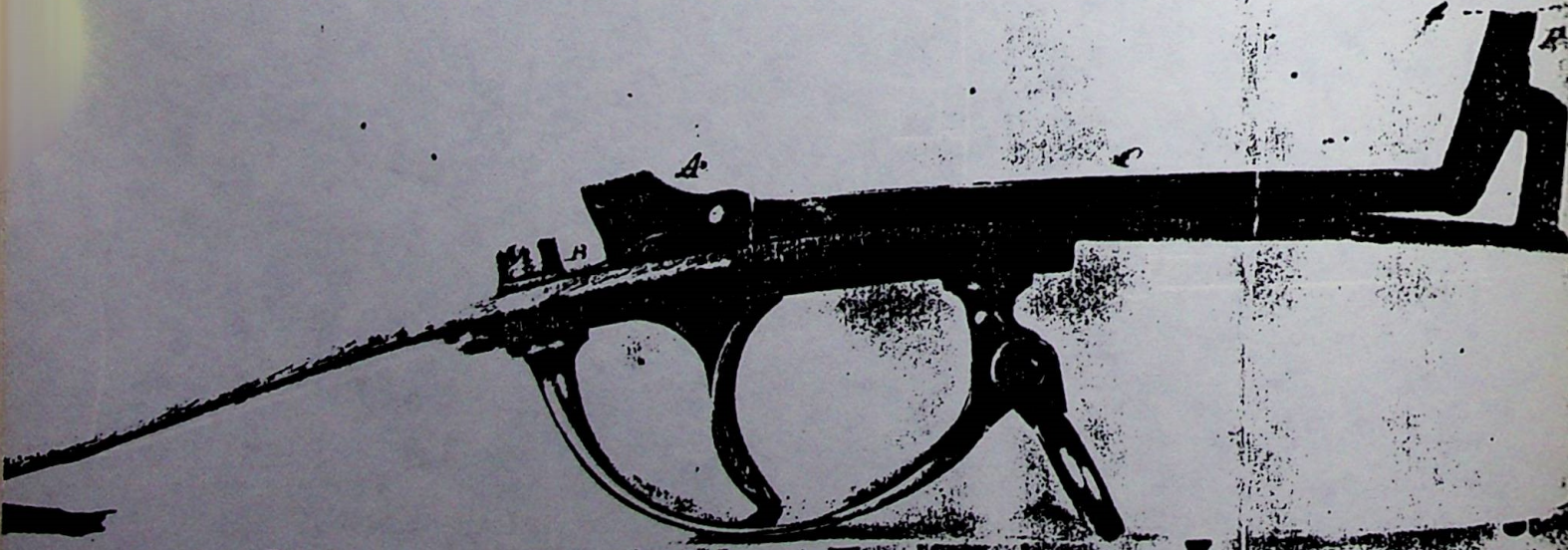


Belgian Pieper Aiming Devices procured for use on the Trapdoor starting in 1887
