SPRINGFIELD FLINT MUSKET FINISHES AND NUMBERING

While doing research on short Model 1841 Cadet muskets, I came across some interesting correspondence on the finishes of 1840s period muskets. The regulation at that time called for browned barrels, bright bands and lockplates, and bayonets finished half browned and half bright (bright blades, browned sockets). The National armories were issuing arms with that finish, also muskets all brown and all bright; additionally, the brown finish was removed from the bands of older muskets to make them comply. It was also stated that there was a widespread practice of staining the stocks with acid to bring out the figure in the wood.

If you have a Model 1841 Cadet musket, I would appreciate it if you would send me a card or note with the lock date, barrel length, and inspector mark.

Several inventories of Springfield Model 1816 muskets on hand in artillery units listed what appears to be a serial number or mark for each arm. This consisted of two letters (usually one capital and one lower case) and 1 or 2 digits. I sorted 76 of these marks together with lock date and company and found they ranged from BW20 to Zc99, with only one duplicate. It appears that these marks were not put on at the time of manufacture, because muskets with earlier lock dates frequently have higher numbers in the same series than later ones; also, the two digits do not seem to represent a rack-number, because they are frequently duplicated within a given company. Burt Kellerstedt reports that such marks appear on the barrels and bayonets of many muskets of the 1820 to 1832 period.

TRAPDOOR-ERA NOTES

* In Dec., 1886, F. W. Freund filed a claim for royalty payments on detachable pistol grips, which he claimed to have invented. His widow was still pressing this claim in 1913, some 27 years later.

* Morse cartridges for the Martini-Henry rifle were made at Frankford Arsenal in 1887.

* A supplemental test of the positive cam mechanism and aluminum-bronze firing pin was held in Jan., 1887.

* In 1886, Col. Kelton had Smith & Wesson make up a special rifle for trial.

* Reports on field trials of the Model 1884 rod bayonet rifle indicated problems with the rods jumping out or sticking.

* The following changes were made to the carbine boot:

- 1) Mouth flared and brass plate added - June 7, 1887
- 2) Lengthened 2 1/8" and position of lower strap changed - Oct. 3, 1887
- 3) Corrected error in manufacture - Nov. 1887

* The sight protector band for carbines was developed in early 1887. It was devised by Sgt. Charles Harding of Troop M, 5th Cavalry.

* Gen. W. B. Franklin, who was vice president of Colt, submitted a magazine rifle for trial in Apr., 1887. It was a bolt action design having a detachable hopper fastened to the left side of the receiver. The hopper held 9 cartridges fed by gravity.

SERIAL NUMBER DATA IN THIS ISSUE

There are a few more Trapdoor and Colt Single Action Army numbers in this issue, from the early Ordnance Dept. records; also, some Krag numbers from the Spanish-American War AGO records. Most of the early SAA revolvers were turned in for new ones at the same time the early trapdoor arms were being replaced by the 1884 model, in 1886.

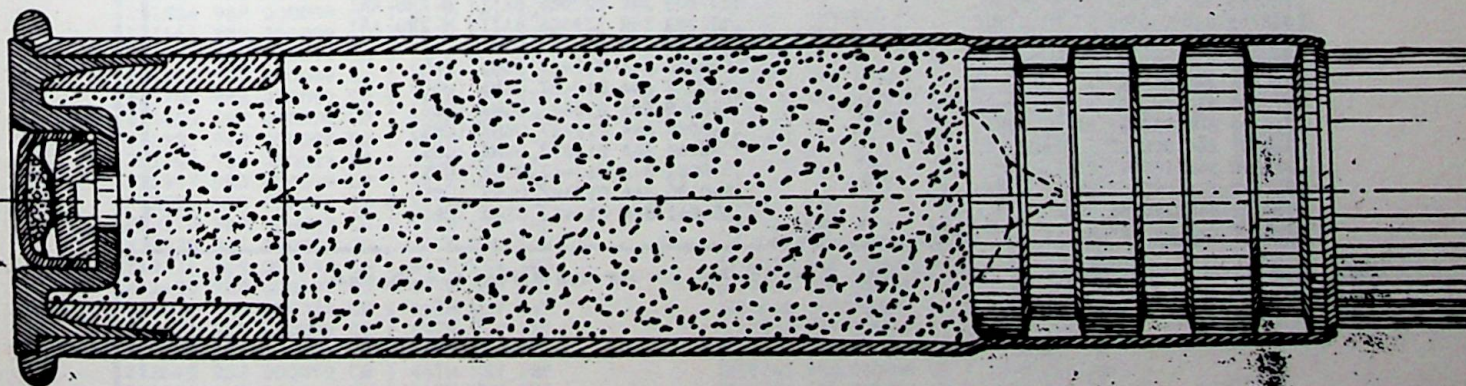
