Miscellaneous News and Notes

MOST of the research during this period was conducted at the Suitland records center, covering the post-war records of the Office of the Chief of Ordnance (OCO). Some pretty interesting material there, including what seems to be the definitive file (about 3-in. thick) on development of the M1C and M1D Sniper rifles. Significant items will be published in the M1-Era Ordnance Notes column.

I copied two more Ordnance documents, on the M1 Carbine, and Bayonets, Knives, and Scabbards (see Product List, inside back cover). I decided to cut off the document copy list at that point, but then I found 24 large boxes of Manufacturing Description Files. These contain manufacturing and inspection details on many weapons, such as carbines, BARs, machine guns, mounts, and various rifles. Some of these would be of interest to advanced '03, M1, and carbine collectors. If you think you would be interested in any of this, send \$3 and I will furnish a copy of the 16-page inventory.

Recently I purchased a copy of Horace Greeley IV's book on the Colt U.S. General Officers' Pistol. I was given to understand that it contained serial numbers and dates of issues of the G.O.P.s, and I hoped that these could be correlated with the correspondence I have been finding that shows dates of issues and names of officers, but not serial numbers. Unfortunately, the book only gives the year of issue, making such correlation impossible. The .380 listing includes 486 pistols, only a third of the 1,500 that were procured. Oddly, most of the pistols we have found cited by serial number in the correspondence are not listed. Although the .380 of the most famous pistol-toter of WWII, Gen. G. C. Patton, is listed (no. 135170), it is not identified to him — furthermore, Patton is not mentioned anywhere in the book, which seems like a serious omission. Gen. D. D. Eisenhower's .380 is identified in a footnote; its number, 135171, is consecutive with Patton's. (Eisenhower turned in the Colt Detective Special revolver no. 477503 upon his retirement in 1951, and I note that the United States Historical Society has commissioned an Eisenhower commemorative 1911A1 pistol — evidently, Ike was a "walking arsenal"). I am attempting to get copies of the

existing serial number data cards on the .380 and .32 pistols, and they will be published in our usual listings when available.

Other significant serial number data found during this period includes several hundred M1911 pistols used in the Mexican Punitive Expedition of 1916, and about a half dozen Colt SAA revolvers issued to Civil Police in the Philippines.


There is a rumor to the effect that all Krag arms at the U.S. Army Ordnance Museum at Aberdeen Proving Ground are scheduled for destruction. I looked into this and was told by the director of Army museums that this is not true; arms are being shifted around and some may be placed in storage, but none in museum accounts are being destroyed.

This (i.e., .22 M2 rifle no. 1283) will bring my total number of documented Springfield's to 14, which represents just about 30% of the collection. The above rifle has the original type 1 locking lug, which is without the headspace adjusting mechanism. This would also appear to be the 8th such M2 rifle sold by the DCM. M2 DCM sales rifles seem to be just about as scarce as the M1922 listings. I note that the great majority of the serial number records in Volumes 2 and 3, as well as the DCM records, are for M1's and M1I's. It is also interesting to note that N. Flaydermann does not describe a DCM sales rifle category for the M2, in the 5th edition of his value guide, but states that the NRA version of the M2 is a "scarce" rifle, and was only issued to NROTC units. I have seen but 4 NRA M2 rifles in my experience, including my own, and they are all DCM listed. I am of the impression that the Springfield NRA M2's may well be truly rare rifles.

The Springfield caliber .22 rifles represent the ideal chance to collect some of the finest and most accurate small bore rifles, ever manufactured by anyone anywhere, at what are still relative bargain prices. A quick look at production numbers will show that about the same number of M1922 M1 NRA rifles were made, as were Caliber .30 NRA Sporters. The M1 NRA is currently valued at only a little over a third of the value for the Caliber .30 NRA Sporter. A service variation of the M1922 M1 rifle is probably five times harder to find than a DCM listed M1903A1 National Match rifle, but would sell for less than half. There may be less than 200 unaltered, original M1922 rifles in existence, but when one shows up for sale, it goes for a third less than that of the Caliber .30 NRA Sporter. Demand, more than supply appears to be the rule, but this is going to catch up soon. I forecast that the values for all models of the caliber .22 Springfields will be going up sharply in the next few years. Springfield collectors will soon realize the overall significance of these rifles in value, quantity and quality.

I appreciate the response that you provid-

ed, concerning my inquiry on the "A" barrel and small star shaped stock marks. I will be looking forward to the next newsletter. In a past newsletter, I noted that your Summary of DCM Rifles Sales 1922-1942 booklet was going "out-of-print". My working and only copy of this booklet shows hard use indeed. I wonder if you might be able to provide one with a new and personally inscribed copy of the booklet, to put away with my collection records.

I agree with you that the Springfield .22 rifles, particularly the N.R.A. sales configuration, are undervalued.

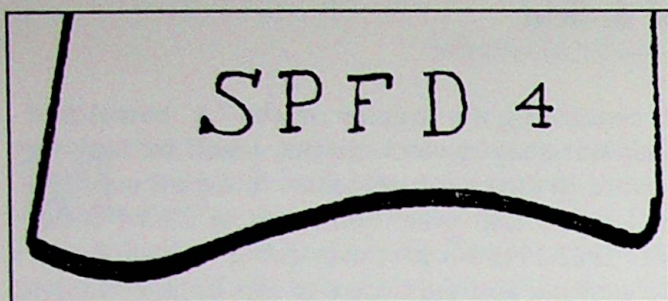
The Ordnance records show that only 50 .22 M2 sales rifles were made up to fiscal year 1936 (all in calendar year 1936). These were drilled and tapped for 'scope, fitted with N.R.A. stock, and had parkerized finish. While they were originally intended for sales through the D.C.M., the Ordnance Dept. decided that the exigencies of the service dictated that they be withheld from sale. Perhaps they did go to the NROTC; I have no record of that. However, it appears that more of these rifles were made later, because sales were made starting in 1937.

*The M1922M1I sales rifle remained in favor even after introduction of the M2, possibly because of its more attractive browned finish. Indicative of this, the Western Cartridge Co. in 1936 placed an order for 5 star-gauged and specially selected .22 M2 rifles. The sales records are available for these rifles (4759 range), and they do not specify the "sales" (i.e. N.R.A.) model. WCC also accounted for the last two recorded pre-War sales of M1922M1I rifles, in April, 1940: serial numbers 20256 and 20819. These were both N.R.A. sales rifles, and 20256 is in my collection. It has a 10-31 barrel date and is drilled & tapped for 'scope; the unusual thing is that it was *not* converted to M2 bolt and magazine.*

Enclosed are copies of data sheets on the 5 carbines I have located with "SPF" markings, as discussed in Number 59.

Thanks much for this information on the Pennsylvania State Police Force trapdoor carbines no. 35343, 43804,



188773 ★, 188778 ★, and 208946 ★. From this limited sample, I would say that the markings were applied by the individual troops, each of which used a slightly different style. A Troop "D" marking is shown above; it is interesting to note that the other side of the buttstock on this carbine has the additional markings "04"/"CP", plus a plate numbered 60. Possibly "04" stands for an earlier acquisition in 1904, and "CP" stands for "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania". (See letter below for additional information on the carbines and other weapons of the Penna. State Police Force).

Volume I of my book (Colonial period through Rev War) is now at the Publisher's (University Press of Colorado), along with its 440 photos and captions. I expect to see it again in 6-8 weeks, during the editing process, then they will do the layout. Should be out by year end.

Volume II (1790's to end of flint period) is also done. I'm going to take a "break" of a few weeks before I begin pulling photos from the files and writing captions, which shouldn't take longer than 2-3 weeks, when I get started. It should be out early next year.

Volume III (Percussion arms) needs 2-3 months' work. I shouldn't have too much problem having it ready to go, so that it will be out by late next year.

This will be followed by at least two volumes on cartridge arms, and a volume on arms imported during the Civil War. However, there's much to do on these. Only the Springfield single-shot cartridge arms section of the first of these two volumes is in the computer, in draft form. There's lots of new material to add to this, plus the rest of them to write. I expect they're 2-4 years from publication.

Sounds like a really monumental work, George. I'm

glad to hear that it is progressing so well, and I am looking forward to having a really comprehensive and accurate reference on U.S. martial arms.

I read the letters from J.G. of Ohio in Issue 59 and N.S. of New York in Issue 60 concerning their M1903 Rock Island NRA sales rifles. Mine is Number 232439 and I enclose my data sheet on it for your record if you are interested - if not, feel free to discard it. Mine also shows fine fit and finish, although it has been used somewhat. The original purchaser supposedly lived in Michigan, and used the rifle in competition for a few years, but took very good care of it.

Some other notes from recent letters and issues that you can file away if interested - I have a M1894 Winchester .30-30 saddle ring carbine US marked and had heard all sorts of stories about them - glad to get the correct information finally. Mine is number 851414. Also have been very interested in the ongoing saga of the Marine Corps snipers, My scope is number 1234, an easy number to remember.

I find that the letters received and sent section in US Martial Arms Collector is of great interest - please keep this up as I always learn something new from these letters and your answers.

Thanks much for the information on your rifles and 'scope. Although such data doesn't go into the main serial number files unless accompanied by official documentation, it is of great value to me and I am sure to other readers.

FYI (attached to letter dated May 22, 1992, on letterhead of Pennsylvania State Police Department Headquarters at Harrisburg, Pa.; text below). Helps to explain why the Penn. police chose the obsolete .45 cal. Springfield.

Would sure like to find one of those revolvers!

"In reply to your letter of November 19, 1991, the following information is provided.

The Pennsylvania State Police, soon after its founding, purchased .45 caliber carbines from the National Armory at Springfield, Massachusetts. It also purchased .38 caliber revolvers from the Pennsylvania National Guard.

Captain John C. Groome, the first Superintendent, divided the constabulary into four companies (later known as Troops) located at Greensburg - A; Wyoming - B; Reading - A; and Butler - D. Each company consisted of one Captain, one Lieutenant, five Sergeants and fifty men, for a total complement of fifty-seven. Badges and collar ornaments bore the company identification numbers from one to fifty-seven. The lower numbers were reserved for commissioned and non-commissioned officers. The one carbine you have bears identification C 67, which undoubtedly indicates that this carbine was issued in 1918, when the Troop complements were increased by the General Assembly.

Numbered badges, collar ornaments, carbines, revolvers and 22" wood batons were reassigned once company personnel resigned from the State Police Force. Because of the significant turnover of personnel, all identified equipment items over the years were used by many different Troopers. In view of this procedure, it would be impossible to tie the four carbines you mention to a specific Trooper.

A majority of the original enlisted men and their early replacements were former U. S. Army cavalymen who needed no firearms training to speak of. Training was mainly centered on converting the men from soldiers to mounted law enforcement officers.

Records concerning the purchase and disposition of early carbines have not been preserved. It is known, however, that the .38 caliber revolvers obtained from the Pennsylvania National Guard were replaced in 1915 with .38 caliber Colt Army Specials. Most likely the old revolvers were traded in on this replacement purchase.

I regret that no further information can be provided in response to your inquiry, and apologize in the delay of my reply.

Very interesting, indeed. I didn't realize that the Penna. State Police Force at that time was a mounted outfit. Good luck on finding one of their Colt DA .38s, which were presumably also marked "SPF".

I have a 1903 Springfield s.n. 592690, barrel date 1-14, insp. cartouche block J.F.C., proof mark block P, one-bolt stock, "R" and upside-down "2" in cutoff notch, "N.R.A." and ordnance bomb on trigger guard. Also, an R.I.A. '03 s.n. 233252 with barrel date 5-13 and "N.R.A." with ordnance bomb

on trigger guard.

They sound like nice rifles. It would be useful to know if the foreend tips are marked "S"; also, any steel lot numbers on barrels and bolts. See following letter.

Regarding the several points raised by N.S. about his Rock Island '03 rifle (p. 60-4):

1) The capital S on the fore-end tip of the stock does not stand for Springfield. As explained in my book (in press), Rock Island made many thousands of stocks throughout its two periods of rifle production. The S came into use shortly after adoption of the .30-'06 cartridge. A practical explanation is that it was to distinguish the new rifle with its shortened stock and barrel, and its new ammunition utilizing the spitzer bullet, from the older but very similar-appearing rifles that used .30-'03 ammunition. Springfield used a small s, but soon phased it out while Rock Island continued the mark through its first period of production. Serial number 235757 is a mid-1913 gun; production ceased in November 1913.

2) It seems to me that a fairly high proportion of late, but pre-war, R.I.A. rifles in original condition bear the N.R.A. mark on the trigger guard. Original rifles, of course, are rare, but those sold into NRA programs were thus saved from future military mayhem.

3) The script proof P in a circle was used by R.I.A. through WWI, apparently to the exclusion of Roman or block P's. Springfield used the script P up to W.W.I, but not exclusively.

4) CN of the cartouche is Danish-born Conrad Nelson, the final inspector. The job paid \$3.50/-day, about half the pay of a top machinist. It is a reasonable guess that C13 on the front face of the bolt lug is a steel lot number. However, such a number may be quite unrelated to barrel steel numbers. Other numbers observed are O13 and D1, both on 1912 guns. This subject needs more attention.

5) The grooved and serrated trigger is correct for 1913.

Additionally, C93 stamped into the barrel on the bottom side between the stock and the muzzle is indeed the steel lot number. Prior to October 1907 (when solid rear sight fixed bases

were adopted) the barrel P and steel lot number were on the lower part of the barrel, between the fixed base rings. After August 1918, Rock Island moved the steel lot number (but not the P) to the top of the rear of the barrel. By this time Springfield had given up on the whole matter. At one time or another, R.I.A. obtained barrel steel from the following companies: Holcomb, Carpenter, Crucible, Midvale, Bethlehem, Krovan, Colonial, and Houghton & Richards. Much barrel steel was supplied by both Carpenter and Crucible, so in the absence of detailed records it cannot be certain which company the C stands for.

Well, that's another mystery solved!

Two comments: Bolt steel was procured separate from barrel steel, to different specifications; it would be the greatest of coincidences to find the same lot number assigned to both. And there can be no question that, on Springfield bolts at least, the bolt marks indicate the

steel lot number: Col. Blunt stated in June, 1910, "... since (the first year of manufacture) each and every bolt has been plainly marked so that the lot of steel from which it was made can be determined if necessary".

The serial number of my "S.C." marked Model 1884 carbine is 382237. The cartouche is dated 1887. "S.C." is about 6 mm high and appears to equal the quality of the "U.S." stamp. However, the "S.C." is slightly offcenter to the left.

I also own a Model 1879 carbine without the "S.C." but with the star notation following the serial number 177023. Cartouche is dated 1882.

Thanks for the info on the markings. Your carbine no. 382237 is beyond the range of known Signal Corps carbines, so I would guess its "S.C." mark stands for "South Carolina". 177023, conversely, is within Signal Corps carbine serial range; but without the "S.C." mark, there is no basis for classifying it as such.

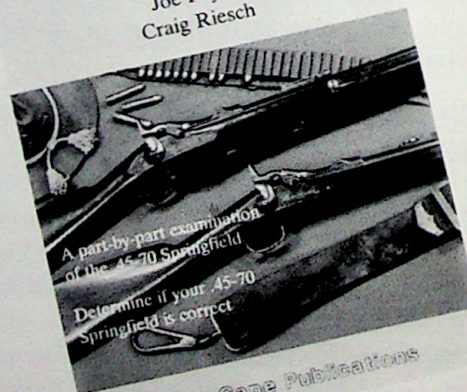

M1-era Ordnance Notes

- An improved slide, incorporating a deflector to prevent ejected shells from striking the shooter, was adopted for the M1 carbine in Nov., 1943.

- The Aerial Cutlery Mfg. Co. was given permission in July, 1945, to complete 25,000 to 30,000 M4 Trench Knives for commercial sale. These knives were not to have Government markings.

- The M1917 rifle was obsoleted on Oct. 3, 1945.

- RIA fabricated about 100,000 bolts with "32" on handles to show they were made of WS3140 steel.

- In Nov., 1945, 150 Cadet swords for the USMA were ordered from the S. E. Eby Co. of Philadelphia. Early in 1947, a contract for 259 more Cadet swords was awarded to Gemsco of New York City. These swords, of inferior quality, were produced by Lilly Ames Co. of Columbus, Ohio. 200 more were procured in 1953, this time from V. H. Blackinton; the blood groove was omitted from these swords. Swords and scabbards were numbered together to avoid mismatching.

- Over one hundred different models of shotguns had been purchased to meet emergency requirements at the beginning of the War. The non-standard shotguns were sold off in 1945-46. All sporting type shotguns in the hands of troops were withdrawn in 1952.

- The sale of Eddystone rifles was discontinued on May 17, 1947, due to cracked receivers.

- M1903 and M1903A1 rifles were declared obsolete on July 24, 1947.

- A number of M1911 pistols were modified to incorporate a magazine safety in 1949 (11 of these will be listed by serial number in a future issue).

- Periodically in the post-WWII period, quantities of Krag M1898 bayonets were overhauled and chrome plated for the USMA. Much of this work was done by Frankford Arsenal. M1905 bayonets were also chrome plated during this period; 1,200 plated M1 bayonets and leather covered M7 scabbards were prepared for the Third Inf. Regt. at Ft. Myer.

- At least 235 S&W .38 revolvers were con-

verted to 2-in. barrel in early 1950.

- Five .380 pistols were shipped to the Chief of Staff in March, 1950, for presentation to the Shah of Iran, King of Saudi Arabia, and Chiefs of Staff of the Italian, Greek, and Turkish armies.

- In June, 1950, it was directed that the hooks on M1/M1C trigger guards be modified to be same as those on the T20E2 rifle.

- The Clarke lightweight rifle was evaluated in 1950; it was given the designation T33.

- In June, 1950, 4,273 Detective Spl. revolvers were purchased from Colt. Regular inspection was waived, and no government marks were to appear on 881. 2,000 of these were for the USAF, and the 881 unmarked ones were shipped to Ft. Holobird for a classified application (probably the C.I.C.). Hammer shrouds were added to five of the C.I.C. revolvers as a trial. S&W shipped eight Chief's Special revolvers to the OCO in Dec., 1950.

- The supply of 1,500 .380 pistols procured in 1944 was nearing exhaustion by July, 1950, and .32 pistols were approved for issue to general officers thereafter.

- Six M1 rifle front sights with silicon-bronze inlay were made for evaluation in Aug., 1950.

- The Ordnance Dept. procured 1,000 Winchester M52 .22 rifles for the Navy in late 1950.

- A .043-in. drilled hole was added to all new M1 rifle windage knobs at the end of 1950, to allow driving out frozen plungers. The practice of applying white markings on M1 elevating knobs had started some time before this.

- In early 1951, it was decided to chrome plate M1 bullet guides with low accelerator cams.

- Army Field Forces Board No. 3 tested lightweight Colt pistols in May, 1951. They recommended further testing of LW .45 and .38 Super pistols.

- At about the same time, Springfield was assisting the USAF in development and procurement of .38 revolvers for air crewman. They tested Colt Detective Spl. revolvers with various combinations of aluminum frame, aluminum cylinder, and steel cylinder; also the all steel S&W Chief's Special. The

production Aircrewman revolvers that evolved were initially assigned two different designations: M12 for the Colt, and M13 for the S&W. The M13 designation was later withdrawn, and Colt as well as S&W (both 5- and 6-shot versions of the latter) were designated M12. Soon after start of production, the proof marking on barrel and cylinder was eliminated in favor of a "P" to be stamped on the left side of the frame. The first and only lot of Colt M12 revolvers were numbered from "A.F. No. 1" to "A.F. No. 1189" on the butts; the first S&W production lot consisted of 605 6-shot revolvers numbered "A.F. No. 1190" through "A.F. 1794"; and 605 5-shot numbered "A.F. No. 1795" through "A.F. No. 2399". The second S&W production lot of 2,591 6-shot revolvers evidently abandoned the "A.F." numbering system. All Aircrewman revolvers were marked "Property of U. S. Air Force" on the backstrap; in addition, the second lot of S&W revolvers was marked "Revolver, Lightweight, M12" on the bevel of the top strap (the first 150 S&W revolvers of the second lot were originally marked "M13" but were re-marked). The cylinder latch bushing was to be omitted from S&W revolvers in the third production lot, and the number of side plate screws was reduced.

- Also in May, 1951, all the M1917 revolvers and M97 shotguns that had been on loan to the Post Office Dept. were formally transferred to them. The Ordnance Dept. disposed of all M1901 .38 DA revolvers at the same time.

- Ogden Arsenal furnished 100 M1911A1 pistols for the 1951 National Matches.

- Changes were made to the guard of the M4 Bayonet-Knife in late 1951, to prevent breakage. 58,522 M3 Trench Knives were converted to M4 Bayonet-Knives by the Japan Logistical Command in 1953.

- The "Sniperscope, Infrared Set No. 1, 20,000 Volts", developed by the Corps of Engineers, was standardized in July, 1951; this unit was adaptable to standard M1 and M2 carbines. The Sniperscope, M2 (which included the M3 Carbine as a component) was designated a Limited Standard.

- The .22/.410 T39 survival weapon was standardized on Dec. 21, 1950, as the M6. Rifle, Survival, Cal. .22 Hornet, M4, became the Substitute Standard. It was decided to mark the receiver of the M6 Survival Rifle-Shotgun "U.S.A.F. Property" rather than "U.S. Property". 50,000 of these were purchased

in 1951.

- The M6 Survival Rifle-Shotgun was modified several times to prevent the magazine box from moving forward and the breech block from loosening in the frame during extended firing. A $\frac{1}{8} \times \frac{3}{4}$ button head rivet was introduced in the frame at serial no. 160820 to keep the magazine in place. Loosening of the breech block in the frame had been cured first with a countersunk rivet introduced at serial no. 105000, and then using a button head rivet from 113000 to the end at 166492. The serial numbers of the M6 guns made by Ithaca started at 100000. In July, 1952, a self-contained trigger group was approved for future procurements of the M6.

- Springfield converted 60 M1 rifles to T35 in Aug., 1951, rechambering barrels, adjusting gas ports, and inserting filler blocks for the T65 ammunition.

- The solid lower band pin for M1 rifle was replaced by a rolled pin in Sept., 1951.

- In Oct., 1951, Winchester submitted a Model 70 rifle chambered for cal. .30M2 ammunition and modified to feed from a ten-round detachable magazine. They proposed this rifle for use as a sniper's rifle, on the basis that it had better accuracy than the then-current standard M1C Sniper's Rifle. The Chief of Army Field Forces determined that "the increased accuracy of the Model 70 Winchester is insufficient to justify its introduction into an already overburdened supply system".

- In April, 1952, it came to the attention of the Chief of Ordnance that a large quantity of Japanese Type 99 rifles had been rechambered for .30 cal. ammunition by the Tokyo Ordnance Depot and furnished to the Republic of Korea National Police. Approximately 45,000 Japanese rifles were converted to cal. .30/06 in 1953. They were assigned the nomenclatures "Rifle, U.S., Type 99 Japanese, Cal. .30 (long)" and - "short".

- Ten National Match quality M1 rifles were furnished the U.S. Olympic Rifle Squad in May, 1952.

- The M1C Sniper rifle, which used a modified Griffin & Howe 'scope mount, was developed starting in 1944; its mount was given the designation M7E1. Due to uncertainty over G&H's ability to supply the required number of mounts, John Garand was assigned to design a mounting system that

could be produced by Springfield; the result was the M1D rifle, which initially was given the designation M8E1 (both rifle and mount). The first lot of 8,300 M1Cs was ordered on Sept. 11, 1944, and 7,254 additional on Nov. 1. Production records give the number produced in FY 45 and FY 46 as 4,971 and 3,000, respectively. In addition to G&H, contractors involved were Lyman for the 'scopes; American Models Inc. of Washington, D.C., for the sun-rain shield; Taylor Brothers Corp. of Columbus, Ohio, for the rubber eyepiece; and Kay Leather Products Inc. of New York City for the leather cheek pad. The material in the eyepiece was Ameripol D-1255, similar to neoprene. Receivers and brackets were initially parkerized together, thus the part of the receiver under the bracket was not parkerized. After May 7, 1945, receivers and brackets were parkerized separately.

The Ordnance Dept. preferred a tapered post reticle for the M73 'scope used on the M1C; however, the needles for these were available only in England, in very limited supply. Consequently, it was necessary to accept a cross hair reticle in the first 2,000 of these 'scopes. The M73 'scope complete with sun-rain shield and eyepiece was given the designation M81 when equipped with a cross hair reticle, and M82 when equipped with the tapered post. The model designation "M73" was inadvertently marked on 149 'scopes in the first lot, and this was crossed out and replaced by "M81". Serial numbers on the first lot of 350 ran from 31501 to 31850.

The M84 telescope was made standard for the M1C and M1D rifles in Jan., 1951, and for the M1903A4 in November of that year. 16,000 were procured in fiscal year 1952; they were to be procured from R. Wendel Inc., L-O-F Glass Co., and Leupold & Stevens. In addition, FA contracted for 3,000 Lyman Alaskan (M73) 'scopes. The Army Field Forces Board No. 3 tested the Tinsley Boone telescope in Jan., 1952.

The M1D Sniper Rifle went into initial production in early 1951. Some changes were made in the bracket, knob, hinge, and base of its telescope mount. The first lot of these used commercial Lyman Alaskan telescopes due to the fact that M82 (government version of Lyman Alaskan) and M84 'scopes were not available.

The M1D remained the Substitute Standard

sniper rifle, with M1C being Standard, until early 1953. In Feb., 1953, Springfield submitted the results of a comparative study of the M1C and M1D that showed certain advantages in manufacture, inspection, maintenance, and rebuild of the M1D. Performance of both types were found comparable, while the 'scope was more readily attached to and detached from the M1D rifle than the M1C. This study resulted in the M1C being replaced by the M1D as the standard sniper rifle for present and future procurements.

- An attempt to develop better handguards for the M1 rifle commenced about 1951, culminating in the procurement of 1,000 metal and rubber forearms in Sept., 1953, for troop trials. A fiberglass-polyester handguard was developed for the carbine, also in Sept., 1953. A year later, Army Field Forces Board No. 3 recommended adoption of this handguard as a preferred item for the M2 carbine. The use of glued-up two piece walnut stocks for the M1 carbine had been authorized in 1943. Of the standard handguards for the M2 carbine, either 2-rivet or 4-rivet was authorized; the 4-rivet was preferred.

- Front sight B620095 and trigger housing D7161828 for the M1/M1A1/M2 carbine were approved in Jan., 1951.

- The Underwood, Elliot, and Fisher Plant in Hartford, Conn., was engaged in overhauling carbines in 1951.

- At the beginning of 1951, 8,257 Johnson rifles and 123,171 M1903 rifles were furnished to the Chinese Nationalist Army.

- In early 1951, Benicia Arsenal was directed to select 300 M1 rifles from current overhaul lines and hold them for issue in connection with the 1951 National Matches. A set of 12 standards were specified for these rifles, additional to the regular overhaul standards. A supply of trigger assembly B021-5546026 was to be furnished to Benicia for use in them.

- Pursuant to a directive from the Ordnance Office concerning production of the M1 rifle in Italy, Springfield prepared drawings and production data for shipment in July, 1951.

- The "M" stamp was deleted from the carbine magazine catch starting April, 1952, and the "P" on carbine barrels was moved from the muzzle end to the chamber end starting Aug., 1952.

· The Chief of Army Field Forces requested that 50 National Match M1 rifles be shipped to Ft. Benning for use by the Army Rifle Team in the 1952 National Matches. It was noted that 75 M1NM rifles had been furnished to the Army Rifle Team in the previous year; however, because those rifles had not been marked to show that they were special rifles, 53 had been inadvertently issued to regular units.

· Springfield Armory was involved in the procurement of the Lightweight Aircrewman .38 revolver as well as the M6 Rifle-Shotgun in mid-1951.

· It is clear from the Ordnance Dept. correspondence that political pressure caused the award of the M1 rifle production contract to H&R.

· The use of Pentrate, Houghto-Black, and other sulfide blackening processes was discontinued at depots and arsenals in Nov., 1951, to be replaced by regular oxide finishes.

· At the end of Jan., 1952, it was directed that the letter "P" (for "poppet") be omitted from M1 rifle gas cylinder lock screws.

· A single M1 National Match Trophy rifle was produced by Springfield and sold to the NRA in 1952. A special Springfield rifle was made up for Gen. Collins early in the same year.

· A demo of the T44 and T47 rifles was conducted by Lt. Col. Crossman in the UK in Feb., 1952. The T44 was subjected to Arctic testing the following year.

· In March, 1952, 50 roller-type bolts and modified operating rods for the M1 rifle were to be tested.

· Four M1 rifles were fitted with mounts and British EM2 unit-power telescopes and sent to the Army Field Forces Board No. 3 at Ft. Benning in March, 1952.

· T20E2 Heavy Barrel rifles nos. 120 and 121 were sent to APG for evaluation in June, 1952.

· As part of a secret project, thirty M1903A4 rifles with 8-power 'scopes were procured for FECOM in 1952.

· At the beginning of 1953, the USMC furnished 600 carbines to the Corps of Engineers for mounting of Sniperscopes.

· A silencer muzzle attachment, developed by the Strategic Air Command for the M4 Survival

Rifle, was tested at APG in early 1953. Because it would reduce the muzzle velocity of the weapon, they recommended against its adoption.

· The drilling of holes in hammers of M1911 pistols to allow attachment of a thong for training exercises was authorized in March, 1953.

· APG evaluated chrome plated barrels for the M1 rifle, M2 and M3A1 carbines, and M1911A1 pistol in 1953.

· Evaluation of various night firing sights for the M1 and M1C was carried out by Army Field Forces Board No. 3 in early 1953. A proposal for "personalized rifles", with adjustable stocks, was also considered in 1953 (at the other extreme, using rough-turned stocks was tested about the same time).

· The T-10 Bayonet-Knife (M5) was classified as standard for use with the M1, M1C, and M1D rifles on 30 July 1953; the M1 bayonet and M7 scabbard were classified as limited standard (even though 75,000 of the M1 bayonets were being procured from Utica Cutlery Co. at this time). A modified M8A1 scabbard was to be developed.

· Keith, Keith, and McCain Co. contracted to furnish 319,893 commercial slings for the M1 rifle in 1953.

· The first National Match M1 rifles were produced in 1953.

· A number of '03 rifles were modified for line throwing in 1954 by boring out the barrels to .315 - .3175". The Rifle, Subcaliber, Cal. .30, M7 was also developed, for use in 75 mm cannons. Red River Arsenal sold a number of M1903A2 rifles in 1954.

· Six hundred M1 NM rifles and 500 NM pistols were made available for issue at the 1954 National Matches. The sale of M1 rifles to civilians was first authorized for participants in these Matches. Galef requested but was denied permission to sell Beretta M1 rifles to civilians in the U.S.

· Hi-Standard Model HD .22 pistols in Ordnance inventories were sold starting in Jan., 1954.

· Seventy four M1903 rifles were chrome plated in 1954 for use by the Third Inf. Honor Guard at Ft. Myer. 4
