



## Miscellaneous News and Notes

### Research During This Period

At College Park, I started through the OSS records recently released by the CIA. There are a lot of interesting stories in here, but so far only a few serial numbers.

Also at College Park, I went through the ordnance files in the records of the U.S. Bureau of Prisons. Most of the arms used in Federal penitentiaries were obtained via the Ordnance Dept. They used standard military arms for the most part, but also a wide variety of commercial arms (e.g., Winchester lever action rifles Models 73, 92, 94, and 95). All of them were added to the data bases (even some Remington .25-20 Model 25 rifles), and it will be interesting to see if any of them turn up with martial markings. Leavenworth Prison reported 20 Krag rifles; no Krag carbines were reported, and I am doubtful that the electric pencil markings observed on some '96 carbines are related to prison usage.

At Suitland, I reviewed some of the Springfield Armory R&D Case Files and some RIA records being held there. Found some interesting material and a few serial numbers (including a few Ruger Mark I pistols and Winchester M70 rifles). Also, I found the numbers of 21 pistols shipped in 1964 and identified as "Pistol, Cal. .22, Training Grade, Commercial". They fall within the serial number ranges 986xxx and 1004xxx. I assume these are M1911-based .22 pistols; but if anybody can shed some light on these, it would be appreciated.

At Archives I, I started through the Ord. Dept. classified files for 1917-40 and also went through some old unit records. I got a lead on some WW1 unit records that contain some serial numbers, and I started through them.

### Earliest Sniper Rifle?

When was the first telescopic sighted rifle used in combat? I found a letter dated Aug. 31, 1860, stating that a telescope made by David Rittenhouse in conjunction with Charles Willson Peale was attached to a rifle and used effectively across the Dela-

ware River at Lamberton, N.J., when that place was occupied by the British during the American Revolution.

Still trying to get access to the M1 and M1903 sales records.





### Raritan Arsenal

A question that is often asked of me is, "Do you know where the Raritan Arsenal was located and when this arsenal was operational?" I would like to know the answer to these questions for all the arsenals that performed rework or assembly of Springfield rifles.

*Raritan Arsenal records at the National Archives go back to 1918, and I believe that it was established in 1917. I am not sure when Raritan was deactivated, but it was still in operation in the early 1960s.*

*Raritan was located in Metuchen, New Jersey.*

*I don't know of any comprehensive information on '03 rebuild facilities, but it could probably be gleaned from Brophy's and Campbell's books.*

### '03 Receiver Finishes

I have been researching the coloration and finish applied to the Springfield Model 1903 rifle receiver during the period between February, 1918, and November, 1918.

Up to February, 1918, the Springfield Model 1903 rifle receiver was casehardened. The oil quench of the casehardening process left a pleasing dark mottled blue-black finish on the receiver. The remaining parts of the rifle were given a blue or black finish that resulted from niter blueing, browning, or oil blackening.

Between February, 1918, and November, 1918, the Springfield Model 1903 receiver was hardened using a double heat treatment process. Like the previous casehardening process, the double heat treatment process also quenched the receiver in oil, followed by an oil bath at 350 degrees F. The remaining parts of the rifle retained the blue or black finish that resulted from niter blueing, browning, or oil blackening.

In November, 1918, the parkerizing process was introduced. As a result, major parts of the rifle, to include the barrel (with sight bases), upper band, and trigger guard were parkerized. The early parkerizing process left a light olive finish on the metal. Apparently, however, the receiver finish remained unchanged and was not parkerized.

Rifles continued to be finished in this manner through 1920. By 1925, many remaining parts of the rifle were parkerized to include the receiver, floorplate, bolt, and bolt sleeve. The later parkerizing process left a medium olive finish on the metal that was slightly darker than the early process. By 1929, the parkerizing process left a dark olive finish on the metal that was darker still than the 1925-vintage parkerizing.

I have observed many Model 1903 Springfield Mark I rifles made during the 1919-20 period. Most were rebuilt and had an olive parkerized receiver finish that was probably applied during rebuild. The receivers of the few original Mark I rifles I have observed, however, (including one in my collection made during 1920) were not parkerized. The receivers had a thick glossy black finish very closely resembling that of glossy black enamel paint. The finish appeared uniformly throughout the receiver. Evidence of polishing beneath the trigger sear confirmed that the finish was original. Presumably, this finish resulted directly from the double heat treatment process.

I have been unable to confirm that the early double heat treated receivers made during 1918 retained this same glossy black finish that appeared the following year on Mark I receivers. If so, then Model 1903 rifles from the 1918 period should have glossy black receivers with the remaining parts blued or oil blackened. I have not been fortunate enough to observe an original rifle from this period to confirm this belief.

Original Model 1903 rifles from the mid-1918 period are very scarce. Virtually all were rebuilt and refinished after WWI with most being parkerized. A few rifles escaped the parkerizing vat during rebuild and I have observed these in collections, including one in my collection. These refinished rifles have a military re-blue finish. This indicates that the original receiver finish could be easily removed and the receiver be re-blued. This also leaves open the possibility that the early double heat-treated receivers made during 1918 were originally blued (or browned). That is, following original manufacture and heat treatment

during 1918, the receivers were stripped, cleaned, and blued before being assembled to a rifle for the first time.

Any information or observations you or your readers may have on this subject would be appreciated.


*I would appreciate receiving a copy of their response.*

### Another Long Range Rifle

In regard to the letter from W.B.R. in Wisconsin on his long range rifle.

My rifle 162403, Bull sight, HGR, the "R" is the same sub-inspector initial that is on the service barrels from 1880-1884; so "HG" are the mystery initials.

The rifling is a uniform one turn in 19 5/8" and not gain twist, nor is the rifling Henry or other odd style; it is a .450 bore, 6 grooves .005" deep, grooves much wider than the lands.



My rifle has the vertical grooved trigger and a wood pistol grip made like the later metal one; I believe that these are the Kelton grips and triggers referred to in the Springfield books by Hill-Frasca and Waite-Ernst.

W.B.R. can check the following to see if his rifle has ever had a pistol grip: the guard screw hole in the service rifle is .911 deep; the pistol grip screw being longer, the hole will be .250 deeper or 1.161" deep.

Enclosed is a photo of the grip from my rifle plus a metal one.

Also, Joe DeChristopher's list of long range rifles in his catalog includes others in this serial range with the grooved trigger; also, page 77 of the Waite-Ernst book states that 36 of the rifles supplied on Col. Kelton's requisitions have grooved triggers and pistol grips designed by him.

### USMC S&W M1917; Another Martial Win. 70

I recently acquired the following guns that may be of interest.

The first is a Model of 1917 S&W revolver, ser. #169xxx, marked as follows:

Bottom of frame at the lanyard ring:

U.S.M.C. 169xxx

Left side of frame: S&W logo

Right side of frame: Made in U.S.A.

Barrel: 169xxx Eagle/S34 (on bottom)

Frame: 169xxx

Cylinder: 169xxx Eagle/S34

Grips (inside): 169xxx

Crane: 43088

Frame at crane: F/43088 Eagle/S2

Top of barrel: S&W patent info.

Side of barrel: S&W DA 45

Finish: green Parkerized

Hammer and trigger: case colored

The only information that I could find on this gun was in "United States Martial and Collector Arms", published by Military Arms Research Service, 20 April 1977, pg. 47, which states:

—Year and month of mfg.: 1919 February

—Note #2: The US Navy and US Marine Corps obtained an undetermined number of these revolvers from the World War I contract.

The other gun is a pre-'64 Model 70 Winchester, ser. # 2x,xxx (1939 mfg.), cal. 30 Gov't 06, in standard hunting rifle configuration.

The gun seems to be in original configuration with all standard Winchester markings plus the following:

Left side of receiver (at the locking lug area):  
U.S./flaming bomb

Right side of stock (between pistol grip and butt plate): crossed cannons,  cartouche in 13/16" square.

Bottom of pistol grip: Circle P with serifs.

The markings look correct, not faked.

The gun is also equipped with a 4X Noske 'scope in a Redfield Jr. mount, and the elevation adjustment has a bullet drop compensator graduated for 100 to 1000 yds and marked "30:06/180 gr/2700 fps". The windage adjustment is marked "USP 2045670".

I have read about guns similar to this but have never seen one marked as this one is.

Any further information would be greatly appreciated.

and noted the discussion on J.F.E. Chamberlain. He was the Principal Subinspector on the First Model Schofield in 1874-5. While most 1st Models bear S.B. Lewis's initials, some have a "JFEC" cartouche.

New topic: Do you have any info on how/when the Colt .38 Super was released by the Army? I understand that many of the ones found in collections today came out of RIA, some by "informal" means.

Picked up a Colt .380 that, per your data from RIA, was issued to BG R. A. Kelser. I noted that you have service record data available on general officers. Is that basically the information that's available in the Army Register?

#### **Markings on Model 1855 Sharps Carbine**

Since my last writing I have managed to obtain a Sharps M 1855 Maynard Primed US carbine about which, naturally, I have a few queries! It has been a long time coming and I'm really glad to have it. It is in very good overall condition with no finish remaining on the metal although all its markings are sharp. Barrel is marked "U.S./J.H./P." at the left near the breech and "H" on left flat just above the forend. The tang bears Serial number 18442. There appears to be the ghost of a cartouche above and parallel to the sling ring bar and possibly another transversely at the rear of the sling bar near the screw although neither of these are decipherable. (In this connection I have read somewhere that M1855 US arms were not cartouched and indeed my M1855 Rifled carbine doesn't show a cartouche either but this may have faded. It seems odd that they should not have been cartouched - are inspectors of the rifled carbine, Pistol carbine and M1855 US Sharps known?) Who is the "J.H." of the barrel mark - would he have been the stock inspector too?

I guess the markings mentioned so far are standard for the model as they accord with the limited information that I can find in Sellers and Reilly although I wish I could find a more complete reference

that would include regimental issues - any suggestions? What possibly sets this example a little aside from the standard model is a further marking on the left buttstock. The letters "WOG" (no periods) are stamped transversely in the centre of the lower stock parallel to the buttplate to be read when the carbine stands on its butt:



The letters are approx. 5 mm tall and stamped approx. 7 mm from the butt plate.

Do your records contain any reference to such a marking, or could you suggest a meaning? Do you think they are a unit marking - "Washington Old Guard" - or something similar? Perhaps the readership might understand the significance and might be aware of similarly marked arms?

Whilst on the subject of M1855 arms, can you direct me to any information on the M1855 Pistol carbine cartridge box? I can find no references to it in period Ordnance publications. Was it intended for both the Pistol Carbine and the Rifled carbine or only the former? Is it known where the boxes were manufactured, in what number and to what units they were issued? I have two examples, one of which appears standard per the description in Todds "American Equipage" and one other with holes for a large oval plate in the flap and tins altered by removal of the dividing plate and lowering the floor of the upper section to accommodate a longer cartridge. Any information on these virtually undocumented cartridge boxes would be most useful and gratefully received.

*The U.S. M1855 Sharps carbines are pretty scarce; it appears that only 400 of these in .52 cal. were procured, with the order being placed in April, 1855, and deliveries occurring in early 1856. According to Coates and McAulay (Civil War Sharps Carbines & Rifles, Thomas Publications, Gettysburg PA 17325), 250 were issued to the 2nd Dragoons between May 28 and Aug. 16, 1856. I believe that the balance were issued to the 1st Dragoons; this regiment was stationed in California until Nov., 1861, and it appears from known serial numbers that some of their carbines fell into the hands of the 1st Calif. Vol. Cav. after the redeployment of the 1st Dragoons (by then redesignated "1st U.S. Cavalry") to join what became the Army of the Potomac.*

*Your carbine was presumably inspected by R.H.K.*

*Whiteley at New York Arsenal and bore his cartouche on the stock. I am not sure who "J.H." was; however, there was a sub-inspector named Hawkins who died in May, 1858. It might also have been Joseph Hannis.*

*The "WOG" marking is unknown to me.*

#### **British-marked Win. 5-A 'scope**

I have a Winchester 5-A 'scope that is marked with the Broad Arrow on the tube. The top of the tube is also stamped with some numbers: "8103" in 3/8" numerals, and "D 8708" in 3/16" size. It has the standard Winchester markings and mounts. Could this be one of the 'scopes discussed in the Senich book?

#### **Colt "Alaskan" Revolver**

I recently purchased a Colt Model 1878---1902 "Alaskan". The pistol is in very nice condition; the SN is 47877. Can you furnish me with any information about this gun? I am a member of the Colt Collector's Assn. and will ask Colt for a letter but I was hoping you could go into greater depth-- I'm more than happy to pay any research fees.

Also, I am toying about doing a short article on these pistols for the Texas Gun Collectors magazine. Could you point me in the right direction regarding original contracts, dates, reason for larger trigger guard, etc.?

*We don't have any of these revolvers in the database, so I can't "letter" your gun.*

*It would cost about \$60 to furnish a copy of the documentation on development and procurement of these revolvers. The trigger was made longer to give better leverage for the stronger mainspring that was found necessary to ensure ignition with ammunition designed for use with the SAA. It was thought that the smaller Filipinos might want to use two fingers to pull the trigger in double-action shooting. That's all there was to it.*

#### **Krag Cadet Rifle Donation**

It is with great pleasure that I send you photographs of your presentation of the Krag CADET RIFLE MODEL 1896 to the Museum at the Military

Academy at West Point.

The return of this historic weapon after an absence of 50 years is truly remarkable. Your presentation of the only confirmed West Point Cadet Rifle will be greatly appreciated by the classes of the future and fills a needed position in the museum's display of cadet rifles.

Thanks for the excellent photos, Wayne, and also for your assistance on the trip to West Point.

The serial number of this rifle (which is illustrated in The Krag Rifle Story) is 35786. I had found Ordnance documentation showing that a Cadet magazine rifle was requested for the West Point Museum on April 2, 1896, had to be specially made, and was shipped there on June 16, 1896, at approximately the time a rifle with this serial number would have been manufactured. I contacted the Museum, and they sent a copy of a record slip which stated that Cadet rifle no. 35736 was traded to a private citizen in 1948. The slip listed an accession number which could be made out very faintly on the buttstock of no. 35786; this number was crossed out and another accession number written above it on the slip. As a result of this trade, the Museum was left without a Krag Cadet rifle; it was the only U.S. Cadet rifle missing from their collection.

A couple of interesting facts were uncovered about museum Krag Cadet rifles:

1) A close examination of the original accession card disclosed that the serial number was originally 35786; apparently, the serial number was changed on the card at the same time that the accession number was changed. This implies that both 35736 and 35786 were in the Museum at one time (which possibly justified trading off one of them); however, there is no record of subsequent disposal of another Krag Cadet rifle.

2) An 1898 catalog of the West Point Museum lists three Model 1896 Cadet rifles. Neither the serial numbers nor accession numbers of these rifles are listed in the catalog. No Ordnance documentation has been found on shipment of

additional Cadet rifles to the Museum.

3) There are four (4) Krag Cadet rifles known in the 35xxx range (35736 not among them). Springfield Armory's Statement of Arms Fabricated, etc., for fiscal year 1896 gives 404 as the number of Magazine Rifles, Cadet, Model 1896, made between July 1, 1895, and July 30, 1896. Ordnance correspondence states that 400 were issued to the Academy on March 28, 1896 (these had been made in 1895 but held at the Armory waiting the calibration and production of Model 1896 sights).

My conclusions: 400 Cadet rifles were manufactured in 1895 and shipped to the USMA in March, 1896. When the request for the Museum was received a few days later, there were none on hand at Springfield and they couldn't be made right away, because the stock making machinery was set up for carbines. Finally in June, Springfield made four more Cadet rifles and immediately sent one to the USMA Museum. The destination(s) of the other three is not known, but it appears that at least one of them was in the West Point Museum in 1898. It is logical to assume that they were made for other museums, but they are not listed in catalogs of the RIA or Springfield Armory museums. ♦

## Model of 1922 Series of Caliber .22 RF Gallery Practice Rifles

### LCDR Frederick M. EWALT, U. S. NAVY (Retired)

The Model of 1922 series of rifles manufactured by the United States Springfield Armory are considered the most accurate, best machined and finished, military caliber .22 rimfire, small bore target rifles ever produced, in the United States or elsewhere. The purpose of this article is to offer fellow Springfield collectors some of my personal observations, gained in over fifteen years of research, on collecting these fine and valuable firearms. M1922 series rifles include three main versions or rifle categories, United States Rifles: (1) — Model of 1922, (2) — Model of 1922 MI and M1922MI, and (3) — Caliber .22 M2. A discussion is provided for each category, followed by detailed comments on actual collecting.

All of the .22 caliber gallery practice rifles were developed as a direct offshoot from the Springfield Armory family of M1903 rifles. Rifle actions, magazine capacity, barrel length, and stock dimensions of the M1922s were generally designed to complement military use of the M1903 service issue rifle. The 1922s were produced with a corresponding product improvement program supported by both in-service evaluation and field inputs from NRA members. Early rifle versions were recalled by SA in order to retrofit the modifications included in newer models. My service background includes considerable heavy ordnance experience in submarine torpedoes, missiles and mines, but the first ordnance material issued to me was an M1903 rifle in boot camp. First is first, and regardless of WW2 infantry fire power and black rifles in NAM jungle fire fights, the M1903 to me, will always be the best rifle that ever came out of the Armory. A significant amount of written material exists for the M1922 series of rifles. Thoroughly researching this, with Springfield Armory National Museum and Smithsonian visits, plus the handling of a large number of representative pieces will provide the best collector education. The best technical references, in my opinion, providing the most valuable and accurate depth of information needed to guide the serious M1922 collector, are as follows:

A. THE SPRINGFIELD 1903 RIFLES, LTCOL

W. S. Brophy USAR (Retired), Stackpole Books, 1985.

A round of significant price increases has already started across the M1922 series rifles. Now is the time, because the last chance for us "working men" to collect reasonably priced pieces may be close at hand. The "good stuff" is also getting harder and harder to find, whatever the price. A complete collection will include at least one example of each of the principal variations, including official arsenal modifications, across the entire series of M1922 rifles. I can always find a reason to justify collecting a good Springfield .22, and duplications are okay since these are valuable rifles and I find that I cannot always part with one in an upgrade situation. This exists in the rest of my M1903 collection also. The illustrations provided for each category of M1922 series rifles are photographs of current examples in my collection.

#### Model of 1922


The Model of 1922 was in various development stages for over five years. The resultant rifle design was principally directed to use by

DCM sponsored rifle clubs and sales to National Rifle Association (NRA) Members. The stock, initially developed specifically for the Model of 1922, was a new sporter length design recommended by the NRA, with a full pistol grip and heavy milled steel shotgun style buttplate. The stock's designation is the M1922 NRA. Wood is a select grade of dense, straight grained American black walnut. The first prototype lot of these NRA stocks, of unknown number, had finger grooves. Contrary to one antique rifle reference, the finger grooves do *not* denote Model of 1922 service issue rifles. These were deleted from all regular production M1922 NRA stocks, no matter what rifle version is involved. This rifle was originally fitted with a Lyman 48B micrometer rear sight having knobs for 1 minute elevation and windage adjustments, and the M1903 service blade front sight. Many of the 48Bs were modified or changed to 48C with knobs for half minute adjustments, both by the Army and private owners to improve aiming accuracy. The 48C was also installed by Springfield Armory on all the later M-1 and M-2 rifles. Note — The 48S is only correct for the Caliber .30 M1903 NRA Sporter. All of the Model of 1922s originally had the Springfield Armory browned (rust blued) finish. Correct rifles have a double heat treated carbon steel bright bolt *not* marked with the rifle serial number, a unique double pin striker activated by a specially machined firing pin rod cap, headless cocking piece, 23 coil mainspring, and long magazine which extends about 5/8ths of an inch below the floor plate. Receivers below about serial number 1600 are milled for the M1903 bolt stop. This part was actually installed on some of the lower serial numbers in this range but it had no function. There is no indent machining on the Model of 1922 bolt to engage a bolt stop. The Model of 1922 receiver bolt stop milling was discontinued after about serial number 1600, and not machined in the

receiver of all subsequent M1922 series rifles.

Total production for the Model of 1922 was only about 2020 rifles. Reference E states that approximately 1900 of these rifles were sold by the Ordnance Department directly to the NRA, for both resale to members and transfer to rifle clubs. An unknown number of the remaining 120 rifles retained by the Army, were issued for service use and evaluation. An additional unknown number, probably much less than 300, were subsequently resold by the NRA back to the Ordnance Department. These also were most probably employed for service use and evaluation. Because of this, there is a scarcity of hard numerical data on the Model of 1922 in the Ordnance records. There is only about 100 listings in the Springfield Research Service serial number database for the Model of 1922 rifle. About 70 direct DCM sales to individuals and 30 or so for military service or rifle club applications are recorded. Additional Model of 1922 receivers are known to have been used to assemble 12 Model of 1924 Caliber .22 International Match Rifles, and 2 prototype Caliber .22 "Outdoor Match Rifles", all with 30 inch barrels. The survival rate for Model of 1922 rifles, in correct arsenal condition, is considered slight and may be about 30% or less of the production total. The Model of 1922 rifle is rightly the centerpiece for the Advanced M1922 Gallery Practice Rifles Collection.

Most of the service issue Model of 1922s were probably recalled by SA and the M-1 changes incorporated into these rifles. Reference A states that 52 rifles in the late 1920s were equipped with the M1922 MI bolt and magazine. It is unclear as to whether a re-marking system was actually employed at this point in time to indicate such a modification. I have never encountered a Model of 1922 modified to M-1. Model of 1922s in service use after 1935 were very likely armory converted to the M-2 configuration. Reference A

also states that in 1937, 30 rifles were converted to M-2. M-2 conversion in the mid and late 1930s included a re-marking system. This is indicated by Model of 1922 receivers hand stamped with an "A" after the serial number, and either "M1" or "M2" hand stamped after "MODEL OF 1922", on either side of "CAL .22". Original Model of 1922 rifle barrel bores were smaller than the M1922 M-1 and M-2 bores by .0005. Most were also damaged by the corrosive ammunition of the early 1920s time period. Barrel replacement appears to have been the normal arsenal practice during an M-2 conversion. The converted rifles were refinished by parkerizing and some of the stocks were replaced with the Caliber .22 M2 version of the service issue stock.

#### **Model of 1922 MI and M1922MI**

The Model of 1922 was accepted in principle for issue as a direct result of the in-service evaluation, but this acceptance was subject to significant redesign of the firing mechanism. The resultant changes included a new rifle designation as "Model of 1922 MI" and a sporter length service style stock with finger grooves, as shown in the illustration below. This new Model of 1922 MI service issue rifle was placed into production in late 1924. The new MI issue stock was based on the type "B" service stock with pistol grip, which was under evaluation to replace the M1903 type "S" stock. Service issue stocks all used the heavy checkered national match style buttplate. Buttplates for rifles below about serial number 6000 also included the trapdoor, but not an oiler. All later production service issue rifle buttplates for both the M-1 and M-2s did not have trapdoors. Stock wood was also a select grade of American black walnut. Firing mechanism changes included a shortened magazine, a single pin striker, and a slightly shortened bolt throw. Rifles were fitted with the Lyman target 48C rear sight and service

blade front sight. The bright bolts were now marked with the rifle's serial number. The M-1 service issue rifles were *not* drilled and tapped for scope blocks and originally had a black parkerized finish. Springfield Armory — Chief of Ordnance Correspondence on rifle finishes, dated in May of 1926, however, would seem to indicate that both NRA and Service Issue rifles should have a browned finish. It is unclear as to whether this means just DCM sales rifles, or all those manufactured in and after the 1926 time frame. The sales records for this time period indicate about equal numbers of both DCM sales and rifle club issue for both NRA and Service Issue type rifles. Reference B states that M-1 rifles issued to rifle clubs were originally finished with black parkerizing. It is possible that either finish may be correct for an M-1 which is not listed as a DCM sales rifle. M-1 production continued from late in 1924 through 1932, for a total of about 20,500 rifles.

The majority of the rifles produced from 1924 to about serial number 7500 in early 1926, were of the service issue variation. These rifles were not offered for DCM sales until late in 1926, however, the M1922 serial number database indicates that a small number of NRA type rifles were issued to DCM rifle clubs in early 1925. Serial numbers in the 3800 range are listed. The NRA variation of this rifle featured the M1922 NRA stock, with the receiver drilled and tapped by the Armory for telescope mounting blocks. After 1926, NRA rifles were produced in increased proportion to the service issue. A total of about 5000, or approximately one quarter of the total number of M-1 rifles, were of the NRA variation. Approximately 1600 rifles are recorded for DCM sales in the M1922 serial number database, of which about two thirds are NRA, with the remainder listed as service issue type. A significant number of NRA rifles are also listed as issued to

rifle clubs. At about serial number 9000, Springfield Armory changed the marking on the receiver ring, which also changed the designation of the rifle. The fourth line was changed from "MODEL OF 1922" to read "M1922MI". This modification was to correct the problem of obliteration of the "M" and second "2" by the scope block holes drilled on the top of the front receiver ring. This change results in four valid collector variations for M-1 rifles, a pair of NRA and service issue rifles, for each of the two receiver markings.


The great majority of service issue M-1s were recalled by Springfield Armory in the 1935 and later time frame, for conversion to M-2. The number is unknown but is estimated to be about 85% or better. The exact number of M-1 NRA rifles converted to M-2 is also unknown, but it is estimated to be probably less than 50% of the production total. It is noted that only 1378 M-1 service and NRA rifles are reported in Reference A, as converted to M-2 by Springfield Armory. The number of conversions performed at other arsenals is unknown. M-2 conversion consisted of replacing both the M-1 bolt and magazine with the M-2 types, hand stamping a second "T" next to the "MI" and hand stamping a "B" after the serial number on the receiver. References A and E note instances of M-2 conversion where either a partial or no re-marking has occurred. The M1922 B issue type stock was normally replaced with the new M-2 issue stock. NRA stocks appear to have been retained if serviceable, with some replaced with new NRA stocks and others with the M-2 issue stock. Rifles were rebarreled, if necessary, and metal was normally refinished by parkerizing.

#### Caliber .22 M2

The status of the M-1 rifles and caliber .22 rifle product improvement was reexamined many times in the period between about 1928 and 1932. The major design changes proposed in the Garand

T1 and T1E1 projects were not incorporated, principally because of cost and the problems of retrofitting earlier rifles. Armory staff officers incorporated Garand's concepts into a new .22 caliber bolt, that could be easily back-fitted into existing M1922 series receivers. The bolt was completely redesigned to incorporate a one piece, short throw firing pin with speed lock and new extractor. The headless cocking piece of the earlier bolts was replaced with a knurled cocking nut, providing gas deflection in case of misfires. The bolt was finished bright as before, marked with the rifle serial number. The Lyman 48C rear and service blade front sights were retained from the M-1. A new M-2 service issue stock was developed, with a redesigned and improved pistol grip, pronounced nose and significantly less drop in heel than the previous M-1 "B" type issue stock. With the exception of finger grooves and buttplate, the new M-2 issue stock more closely resembled the M1922 NRA stock rather than the "B" type. The M-2 rifles all were parkerized in finish. The new and improved rifle incorporating these changes, which also included a somewhat longer magazine, was redesignated as the Caliber .22 M2, with production starting in the second half of 1932. The first production of the M-2 was at a relatively moderate rate, and only up to about serial number 7800, in late 1941. All M-2 serial numbers above about 7800, are 1942 and later WW2 production. A significant but unknown number of M-2 actions were assembled in WW2 as M2A1 sub caliber devices. Reference A notes M-2 rifle production in mid 1942 up to about serial number 11,000. Reference B notes that a receiver serial number above 21,000 was observed in WW2. The final total is unknown.

References A and B both state that the bolt locking lug of approximately the first 3,800 M-2 rifles did not have a head space adjustment mechanism. This is the first recognized collector variation.

tion for this rifle, and serial number 3862 in my collection is an example. Headspace maintenance was a recognized problem with previous M1922 series rifles, and this shortfall was quickly remedied in the M-2 design process. The rear bolt section's locking lug was redesigned to provide for an adjustable screw base to actually contact the rear receiver ring locking face, rather than the back of the lug. Most of the first production lot of M-2 rifles were recalled by the Armory and retrofitted with the rear bolt change. In the course of M-2 development, there have actually been three types of headspace mechanisms. Armory modified rifles below about serial number 3800 will normally have open, slotted screw type adjustable head space mechanisms. Between about serial numbers 4000 and 6500, the adjustment screw should generally be sealed with white's metal and embossed with the ordnance bomb icon. Over 6500, the adjustment screw will usually be an allen head wrench type. Service issue rifles in the serial number range of about 3800 to 7800 were originally assembled with the adjustable head space bolts and are considered as the second M-2 rifle collector variation.

The third recognized collector M-2 variation is the NRA rifle. This rifle was Armory drilled and tapped for telescope blocks, is mounted in the M1922 NRA stock and is parkerized. The serial number range for M-2 NRA rifles appears to be between 5581 and 6561. M-2 NRA rifles may well be the lowest in actual production numbers for all

of the M1922 series variants. The M1922 serial number database lists only about 77 total M-2 NRA rifles sales between 1937 and 1941. The database lists numerous M1922MI and MII NRA rifle issues to service applications and rifle clubs in the same time frame, but no similar service issue of M-2 NRAs. The actual number of NRA M-2 rifles produced is unknown. The fourth collector M-2 variation represents the rifles, above about serial number 7800, that were originally assembled in WW2. The majority of these rifles will have barrels marked 1942 and later. These barrels are about one half inch shorter than prewar manufacture, and cut square at the muzzle crown.

The only arsenal modified M-2 rifle that could be considered a collector variant is one below about serial number 3800, a first variation rifle in arsenal condition, except for a replaced bolt. At some point in time, in the mid 1950s, the Army recalled all service issue and rifle club M1922 series rifles. These were replaced with Remington, Savage and other commercially manufactured caliber .22 RF target rifles. The number and types returned is unknown. Armory records seem to indicate that most of these returned rifles were minimally overhauled, then stored pending disposition. Reference B notes that all of these rifles that were allocated to the DCM appear to have been sold as surplus in 1957, with the sale sold out in only two weeks.

## Comments on Collecting M1922 Series Rifles

This article only addresses collecting the M1922 series rifles that were both sold to rank and file members of the NRA and issued for general service use. A total of fifteen M1922 series rifle collector variations are discussed in depth. Not addressed are M1903 Hoffer — Thompson Caliber .22 rifles and the Winder Muskets, which would properly be the subject of separate articles. Highly specialized rifles such as the International Match .22s, M-1 .22 centerfire "HORNET" rifles and the experimental Garand T1 and T1E1 caliber .22 RF rifles developed to correct M-1 problems are also not addressed, since these are normally beyond the means of all but a very few Springfield collectors.

There are some good guns still left out there. In mid April (1997), I located a rifle that was on my "Hit List" for years. It was near mint and purchased at a reasonable price, from a well known Antique Springfield Dealer. You will, however, have to be able to search, examine and bargain relentlessly to achieve your collection objectives. I have observed a significant price increase for all manner of M1903 and related ordnance material, coupled with a marked drop in quality of condition, over the last year, at both gun shows and in the mail order advertising periodicals. There *never* was a large number of M1922 series rifles in circulation. The total production for all variations was only about 42,000. Reference A notes that about 45% of these were probably arsenal repaired or otherwise modified. Reference E notes that Rock Island Arsenal, at some point in the past, may have destroyed over 11,000 in an unknown mix of some or all of the variations.

In general, "Let the Buyer Beware", since M1922s are also not exempt from the "problems in validity" plaguing the entire M1903 collecting spectrum. Restocking and/or refinishing is common. In this day and age, the term "Original" is probably wistful thinking. I am satisfied with a piece that is "Correct, as to Arsenal Condition", at time of manufacture. Spurious markings, for both wood and metal, are also quite common; now and over 95% are not from any arsenal. WW2 Remington "R" marked parts, such as the trigger, sear, bolt sleeve and safety knob are quite common. Lyman

48 rear sight components are frequently not matched-up by serial number. Bolts may not be matched to the receiver serial number. Bargain and pay accordingly. Problems like these can be corrected by a lot of restoration work but remember, although the end result may be a correct rifle, it is *not* an "Original" rifle.

### Model of 1922

Every collector seriously interested in the M1922s should have at least one Model of 1922 in his collection. The right rifle will be very hard to find and priced accordingly. Many privately owned Model of 1922 rifles were gunsmith drilled and tapped for telescope mounts. Stocks were also checkered and/or cut down, and otherwise modified for sporting use. Many original Model of 1922 rifle barrels were also replaced because bores were damaged by the corrosive .22 ammunition of the time period. In my entire collecting experience, I have personally examined only about twelve Model of 1922 rifles that were purported to be "original". The only problem with one was 48C 1/2 minute elevation and windage knobs on the rear sight. I can live with this and the rifle is in my collection. Another was flat perfect and it is also in my collection. Several were clearly and expertly refinished, but the work was not arsenal quality. One refinished rifle had the barrel relined with a 6 groove sleeve, and was severely pitted below the stock line. On another, the barrel date was draw filed out and crudely restamped to make it appear original. Several had replacement "N.S." marked rear bolts. One rifle was actually very good overall, but had a somewhat "scruffy" bore. Several had 1903 striker home gunsmithed replacement firing pin caps, one of which was still marked with a small "R", and M-1 magazines. Another had home gunsmithed finger grooves, and a M1922MI headless cocking piece, which malfunctions in the Model of 1922. Some of these problems could be corrected by restoration efforts but how much are you willing to pay?

It is an option for the collector as to whether a Model of 1922 rifle that was arsenal modified, represents a variation to be included in the collection. In my opinion it is a legitimate collectible and the extreme rarity represents a significant challenge. It will definitely be harder to find one

of these, than an unmodified piece. I have personally examined only 4 such rifles, of which 2 were pitted and rusty wrecks, one in a "B" issue stock and the other in a Cal. .22 M2 issue stock. The other 2 were in excellent physical condition, and mounted in the original M1922 NRA stock. All 4 had late 1930s barrels. The small number of service issue combined with privately owned rifles that were converted to M-2 is also unknown, but is probably in the range of much less than 200. Model of 1922 rifles converted to M2 are very scarce, and seldom encountered.

#### *Model of 1922 MI — M1922MI*

The M-1 service issue rifle, with either of the two receiver marking variations, may well be the highest priced and most difficult of the M1922 series rifles, to locate. Most genuine examples I have examined all show considerable but honest wear and tear. Those service rifles in excellent or better condition are probably DCM sales rifles, since like the NRA variations, most of these have always been in "private hands" and have escaped the hazards of arsenal overhaul and modification. An NRA rifle, with the second variation of receiver markings, will be the unmodified M-1 most generally encountered. Rifle bores have a very high survival rate. Most rifles I have examined have excellent or better bores, and the barrels appear original. I have examined service issue and NRA rifles, with beat up receiver rings, that were clearly an attempt to put an MII back to MI configuration. I have also examined an NRA rifle, mounted in a "B" stock, which a dealer insisted was a correct version of a service issue rifle.

It is a collector's option as to whether arsenal modified M-II rifles represent valid M-1 variations in the collection. Service issue and NRA M-IIs are equally the most commonly encountered M1922 series rifles. Too many dealers at Gun Shows, these days however, are trying to sell these rifles at unmodified M-1 prices. Common collecting physical problems are thrashed and/or mismatched stocks, mismatched Lyman 48 sights and bolt serial numbers.

#### *Caliber .22 M2*

It will be a toss-up as to whether a first

variation M-2 service rifle, from the first production lot with the non-adjustable headspace bolt, or an NRA rifle as the third M-2 variation, will be the highest priced and most difficult M-2 rifle, to locate. Good examples of unmodified service rifles of the second type M-2 variation are also quite difficult to locate. The fourth type M-2 variation, with serial numbers above about 7800, regardless of the barrel date, are *all* WW2, 1942 and later assembly. These are the most commonly encountered correct M-2s in today's market and the usual collecting problems, besides condition and cost, are arsenal overhauled M-2 rifles which are very difficult to identify. This is much more of a problem for M-2s, as compared to the M-1s, since there are no special identifying receiver marks. The best indicators are serial number production dates that are mismatched with respect to barrel date and/or the headspace adjustment mechanisms. Stocks on overhauled M-2s are also marked with inspector cartouches and/or circle "P" proof marks. Mismatched Lyman 48 sights and bolt serial numbers are also common. The unknown number of M-2s originally assembled in WW2 as M2A1 Sub-Caliber devices are probably above the 7800 serial number range. How many were converted to the M-2 service rifle configuration is also unknown. These rifles, in appearance, should resemble other overhauled M-2s, but do not bet on it.

The recall for replacement of the bolt in first variation M-2s, is the only arsenal modification which is a legitimate collector variant for this rifle. The only identifying marks are the bolt itself and the serial number. The question to the collector is whether this rifle is a modified first variation or correct second variation. Correct as to arsenal condition would seem to place the serial number above about 3800, but reference B notes that some rifles over serial number 4750 were originally assembled with this first type bolt. This discussion is now closed with my noting that a second variation M-2 service issue rifle in the serial number range of about 4000 to 7800 is still the outstanding "hole" in my collection. Good luck, and as Bill Brophy stated in all of his personal inscriptions in Reference A, "WITH THE BEST WISHES OF THE AUTHOR AND THE HOPE YOU FIND MANY GREAT 03s" ♦


